#### Suitable Extinguishing Media

Carbon dioxide, regular foam, dry chemical, water spray, water fog, Water or foam may cause frothing.

#### **Precautions for Safe Handling**

Keep away from heat, sparks and naked flames. Where flammable mixtures may be present, equipment safe for such locations should be used. Use clean tools and explosion-proof equipment. When transferring large volumes of product, metal containers, including trucks and tank cars, should be grounded and bonded. This product has a low vapor pressure and is not expected to present an inhalation hazard under normal temperatures and pressures.
